You will receive your testing ticket in homeroom advisory today and you should bring this along tomorrow morning, as well as #2 pencils, eraser, and a calculator (graphing or scientific) to the main gym at 7:45 for testing. Testing ends at about 11:15 a.m. followed by a pizza lunch provided by the school with Juniors back in class by noon. The scores achieved on this assessment will not affect a student's class grade, but will give valuable information as all of our juniors prepare to take the official state ACT test as a school later this year on February 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>.
