#### ACT Aspire 10 Testing:

**As a reminder, ACT Aspire testing for all 10th graders will take place this week Tuesday and Wednesday, April 16 and April 17.** The assessment will be given to students over two days during a morning and afternoon session for regular education students (on the chromebook in a large group setting / Auxiliary Gym) based upon their last name, while those students with accommodations per their special education IEP or 504 plan will begin each day at 7:45 am in the library. Once again, please be sure to get a good night sleep and eat breakfast on these testing days and remember to bring a calculator, something to write with, and leave all technology in your locker as it cannot be used or accessed during testing including break times. If you are in possession of or use technology, you will be removed from testing and scores will be cancelled.

10th grade homeroom teachers, please review the slide presentation below during homeroom today to get students focused on ACT Aspire Testing the next two days.

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## **School Safety – Tornado Drill**

Last week was Tornado awareness week, but with the testing schedule we postponed our yearly tornado drill until this week Thursday after the ACT Aspire 10 testing is done. With a statewide average of 23 tornadoes occurring annually, we need to be prepared and know how to respond keeping everyone safe. So, this **Thursday, April 18th we will perform a practice tornado drill during 3rd hour**. As in the past, we will not have homeroom on Thursday and add the time directly to third hour, so upon return from the drill class can begin. In preparation for the drill and in the event of a real tornado, all teachers will review your safety locations this week with each hour as each room has its specific safe location. In general, all classes will be relocated to either the first floor halls or interior classrooms staying away from outside windows and glass.

In an effort to promote a safe and drug & alcohol free celebration, and in support of April being proclaimed as Alcohol Awareness Month by Mayor Devine, we will once again be having our Annual Safe & Sober Spring Family Night on Monday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 pm in the Nathan Hale Auditorium. Nathan Hale and Central HS will once again be working in collaboration with the West Allis Police Dept. and the Community Coalition to present on the dangers and consequences of substance use and keeping safe and drug & alcohol free during the upcoming year-end celebrations, as well as driving safely and not texting or using phones while driving as part of National Distracted Driving Awareness month. As part of the event, “Triple A”, the American Automobile Association will be doing an interactive presentation around the topic of distracted driving with students possibly having access to a simulator during the week at lunch and on that evening. We want to encourage parents to attend this event with their son or daughter to help educate and ensure the safety of our students during these year-end events. Students who attend this resource night with their parent/guardian will receive a \$10 discount voucher to be used toward the purchase of a Prom dance ticket. We hope to see our students and parents in attendance.

**Senior Support Wednesdays:** Student Services will be hosting Senior Support every Wednesday in April from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. The support is divided into 2 areas: academic support and post-secondary support (i.e. scholarship support, consultation, college applications etc.) Computer access will be available. Some students have been assigned by a counselor or teacher and are strongly encouraged to attend these sessions. All students signed up will receive a reminder pass. ### **Carrie Crystal Stuckert Memorial Scholarship**

**Deadline: April 26th**

**Description:** The Dream Pool Foundation is once again offering their 2019 Art Scholarship and will be awarding **two \$2,000 scholarships and three, \$1,000 scholarships**. Interested applicants must possess extra-curricular accomplishments and inspirational goals. Academically capable students must be enrolled as an Art major at an accredited institution of higher education located in the United States. All applicants must be US citizens. Recipient will be required to provide evidence of college acceptance before money is awarded.

#### **Requirements:**

1. Visual Arts Program Major (including Art Therapy)
2. Evidence of involvement in activities in the school or community

**Deadline: April 25th**

### **[Richard Pilak Memorial Scholarship](#)**

**Deadline: April 27th**

**Description:** The purpose is to honor the memory of Richard A. Pilak and to provide financial assistance to a chosen graduating senior from either West Allis Central or Nathan Hale High Schools who will be enrolling in an institution of post-secondary education in the upcoming fall.

**ELIGIBILITY** - Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Be a legal resident of the West Allis/West Milwaukee et al. School District.
- 2) Be enrolled at West Allis Central or Nathan Hale High Schools, will graduate in June, and will be enrolled in an institution of post-secondary education in the upcoming fall.
- 3) Complete all questions on the application form.
- 4) Submit one letter of recommendation for the scholarship from a teacher, school administrator, employer, or religious clergy.
- 5) Submit a copy of grade transcript.
- 6) Submit a brief explanation (less than 100 words) of why you want this scholarship.
- 7) Allow the Richard A. Pilak Memorial Scholarship Charitable Trust to release recipients name to the public.
- 8) Attend the award presentation, if requested.
- 9) Applicant acknowledges award is non-transferable.

**DEADLINE:** Completed applications for the scholarship must be received by the Richard A. Pilak Memorial Scholarship Charitable Trust no later than April 27, 2019.

### **Scholarship Criteria**

Must be a high school senior

Must have at least a 2.5 GPA/Cumulative grade point

Must be a Wisconsin resident and US Citizen Have the intent of being enrolled as a full-time student at a four-year accredited institution beginning the fall after graduation

Must complete scholarship application and provide required documents

Must attend interview when notified of date and time

Demonstrate financial need

All documents must be postmarked by April 30, 2018
