ACT Aspire Testing:

As a reminder, ACT Aspire testing for all 9th graders will take place this week Wednesday and Thursday, April 10 and April 11. The assessment will be given to students over two days during a morning and afternoon session for regular education students (on the chromebook in a large group setting / Auxiliary Gym) based upon their last name, while those students with accommodations per their special education IEP or 504 plan will begin each day at 7:45 am in the library. Once again, please be sure to get a good night sleep and eat breakfast on your testing days and remember to bring a calculator, something to write with, and leave all technology in your locker as it cannot be used or accessed during testing including break times. If you are in possession of or use technology, you will be removed from testing and scores will be cancelled. See below for the complete testing schedule.

[Nathan Hale Blandino Scholarship](#)

Deadline: Monday, April 8 (**Today**)

Description: The Blandino Scholarship awards are scholarship awards of \$500 for athletes of West Allis Nathan Hale High School. This award recognizes the student athletes for their academic achievements, their leadership in student & athletic activities as well as sportsmanship, school spirit, character and good citizenship.

Eligibility: To qualify for the awards the athletes must have participated in 8 sports the 4 years of high school with at least 1 sport per year (example: basketball all four years would be 4 of the 8 needed to qualify). All fall, winter, spring and summer sports for all years freshman through senior years count towards qualification. Poms and Cheerleading count as two sports per year because they are full school-year commitments.

The student athlete must have a 3.8 cumulative GPA at the end of the 7th semester.

There must not have been any district athletic code violations during their high school years.

The students involved in a spring sport their senior year must complete the sport before being given their award (unless they qualify prior to that sport).

Each student will also receive a plaque along with their scholarship award.

The student athlete must submit and fill out the application.

The student athlete must write a short essay on what sports meant to him/her during their high school years.

The student athlete must be a Booster Club Member (or his/her family) all four years of high school

Requirements:

Deadline: April 27th

Description: The purpose is to honor the memory of Richard A. Pilak and to provide financial assistance to a chosen graduating senior from either West Allis Central or Nathan Hale High Schools who will be enrolling in an institution of post-secondary education in the upcoming fall.

ELIGIBILITY - Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Be a legal resident of the West Allis/West Milwaukee et al. School District.
- 2) Be enrolled at West Allis Central or Nathan Hale High Schools, will graduate in June, and will be enrolled in an institution of post-secondary education in the upcoming fall.
- 3) Complete all questions on the application form.
- 4) Submit one letter of recommendation for the scholarship from a teacher, school administrator, employer, or religious clergy.
- 5) Submit a copy of grade transcript. 6) Submit a brief explanation (less than 100 words) of why you want this scholarship.
- 7) Allow the Richard A. Pilak Memorial Scholarship Charitable Trust to release recipients name to the public.
- 8) Attend the award presentation, if requested. 9) Applicant acknowledges award is non-transferable.

DEADLINE: Completed applications for the scholarship must be received by the Richard A. Pilak Memorial Scholarship Charitable Trust no later than April 27, 2019.
